Beattie, aged 62 years, farmer, of Boustead Hill. The body was identified by Mr J R Beattie, Plumdon, Annan, brother of the deceased. Margaret Eleanor Bulman, manageress of the Joiner's Arms Inn, Aikton, said she had known Mr. James Beattie for over twenty years. It was a general thing for him to go to her house for the Sunday papers and have his tea, and he did so that Sunday, that arriving about two o'clock in the afternoon. He complained of feeling cold. He go the papers and read them, and had tea between half-past four and five o'clock. Witness then went out for a few minutes across the field, but the servant girl shouted to her and when she went back to the house, found Mr. Beattie sitting on a chair breathing heavily. She got some water and bathed his forehead, but he died shortly after.

- - - The Coroner found death to be due to angina pectoris. Mr. Beattie, who belonged to the Annnan district, had farmed in Cumberland for about thirty years—at Kingside Hill, Aikton House, and for some years on his own holding at Boustead Hill. He was a member of the Committee of the Kirkbride Agricultural Society and a member of the Cumberland Pig Breeders' Association ever since it was started.

A GRETNA HOTEL

Mrs Thomasina Beattie, South View. Springfield, appealed against the decision of local tribunal refusing her claim in respect of her only son, Robert J. Beattie, railway clerk, on the ground that she was a widow and partially dependent on him. The local tribunal stated that appellant previously carried on the Queensberry Hotel at Gretna, now taken over by the Control Board, and they did not see any grounds which would warrant exemption. Mr Haining, solicitor, stated on behalf of appellant that she had not yet been paid the small balance due to her by the Control Board There were a son and daughter, the son being employed with the G. & S-W Railway Company at Gretna, making a wage of 21s 3d. The daughter could not anything to support herself, and both she and the mother were practically dependent on the son's wage, such it was. The hotel changed hands at a price but when claims were met there would be very little. Mr M'Lean: Does the Control Board not pay any compensation to Mrs Beattie when taking over the hotel? Mr Haining: The price is paid. Mr Maitland Heriot; Is It not the case that you got the option of staying at the hotel? Mrs Beattie: Yes, but I was not able to so. Mr Maitland Heriot: If you could that, it looks to me that you are not entirely dependent on your son. To what extent are you dependent? Mrs Beattie: fully. Maitland Heriot: That of course is where the local tribunal may be wrong, as they believed that there were other means, and did not know you were practically dependent on your son.

The appeal was refused

About a year ago he became managing director of the newly-started moss litter works at Kirkbride, Cumberland, and resided in Annan, crossing the Solway Viaduct daily for the discharge of his duties. Mr Biggins was greatly interested in musical matters. He was the first organist in the United Free Church, Gretna, and, afterwards was organist in Kirkpatrick-Fleming Parish Church. Subsequently he became organist in Gretna Parish Church. When he left the U. F. Church at Gretna he was presented with a bicycle, and he also received a presentation from the Parish Church on severing his connection with it. He was a Freemason, having been for many years a member of Tyne Lodge, No. 991, Newcastle. He was fifty-one years of age, and leaves a widow and a family of two sons and two daughters.

His eldest son is also a skilled organist. The funeral takes place to-day at Gretna. There will be a memorial service in the Parish Church, in which the Rev. J. O. Stafford, Gretna; Rev. J. Walker, Kirkpatrick-Fleming and the Rev. D. Eaglesham, Gretna, the ministers of the three churches with which Mr Biggins had been professionally connected, will take part.

Kirkpatrick Fleming Man's Narrative

Mr Lancelot Black, Grahamshill Cottages, Kirkpatrick Fleming, has received some interesting letters from his son, Private George Black, Ist Battalion Gordon Highlanders, 3rd Division British Expeditionary Force, extracts from which are as follows: We had lovely sail up the Seine when coming here, and if it had been summer time this glorious country would take a bit of beating for scenery. We get plenty of excellent cigarettes out here, so don't need to do without a smoke, and also get plenty of clothing of various kinds sent us by the good people of Britain. We get four days in the trenches and four days out, and while we are out of the trenches we are billeted in farms. We have all been supplied with a fur jacket, and if you only saw us all you would think were a lot of Eskimos. I have some rare good chums from Motherwell. While in the trenches I can tell you the bullets and shells make fine music. You can bear the shells screeching like demons of an infernal region from the enemy's guns the greater part of the day, while at night the rifles start their chorus. It is something terrible to do duty under circumstances like these. So you will see we are kept from wearying. We have plenty of tobacco, but matches are very scarce. The weather is something awful, for it has rained every day since we came. When we came out of the trenches we had to wade through many feet of water to the road. I am glad to say I still keep well and fit, and just came out of the trenches last night, and will be back again on Monday night.

Foreman Surfaceman's Sad Death

An accident of a distressing character occurred on Friday morning a short distance north Gretna Green station on the Glasgow and South-Western Railway. As the 8.15 passenger train from Dumfries to Carlisle was slowing down on approaching Gretna Green station Robert Johnstone, foreman surfaceman, residing at Gretna Green Cottages, was engaged examining the line along with one of his men, Thomas Straiton. He was in a kneeling position in the four-foot way, and he and his companion were so intent on their work that they failed to notice the approach of the train. Straiton was clear of the line and escaped, but Johnston discovered too late that the train was upon him, and he was in the act of getting up when he was struck by the front of the engine about forty yards off the signal cabin, and thrown some distance. The train was stopped as quickly as possible. The stationmaster, Mr Jas. Gibson, was apprised of the accident, but on examining the body found that death had been instantaneous. The body was removed to the station premises, and later in the day was conveyed home. Deceased was 33 years age, and had been in the employment of the railway company for eleven years For the past 2 1/2 years he had been foreman, and located at Gretna Green. He was of an obliging disposition, and was popular with his men. He is survived by his widow and young family, two boys and a girl, the oldest boy being nine years ago. The funeral took place on Monday to Gretna cemetery, and was very largely attended, amongst the mourners present being Mr Gibson, the stationmaster and a good number of railwaymen. The service was conducted the house the Rev. J. O. Stafford, parish minister, and the Rev. David Eaglesham, Chapelknowe United Free Church.

GRETNA SOLDIER'S SUDDEN DEATH. The sad news reached Gretna on Saturday of the sudden death of Mr John Boyle Kerr, son of Rev. Cyril Kerr, minister of All Saints' Church, Gretna, and St John's, Eastriggs. Mr Kerr had been serving with the Royal Corps of Signals in Glasgow and had died that morning. Mr Kerr, who was twenty-three years of age, joined the Royal Corps of Signals three weeks ago and had proceeded to Glasgow. On Friday he had complained of not feeling very well. After midnight he asked a comrade for a drink of water, and after taking it collapsed and died. A doctor was called and expressed the view that death was due to poisoning. How poison could have got into his food can only be conjectured. Apart from his complaining of not feeling well his comrades had no other evidence of Kerr's illness. Mr Kerr was the only child of Mr and Mrs Kerr, and much sympathy is felt for them in their sad and sudden bereavement. Prior to joining the Royal Corps of Signals Mr Kerr was employed in the Electricity Department of the Dumfries

County Council and was engaged at Gretna. He was educated at Dumfries Academy when his father, before going to Gretna, was curate of St John's Church, Dumfries. Mr Kerr was a young man of exceptional promise, and was of a likeable and bright disposition, and by all was held in high esteem. The funeral took place to Rigg Cemetery on Tuesday. Prior to the interment a service was held in All Saints' Church, Gretna, which was attended by a large congregation. The mourners included officers of the Royal Corps of Signals., Glasgow. Many friends throughout the county will learn with regret of the death of Mr D. R. Macintosh, proprietor of Gretna Hall, Gretna, which occurred yesterday. A native of Inverness, Mr Macintosh came to Gretna after the Great War, and took over the motor business which was known as Gretna Motor Company. Being a man of considerable enterprise, he greatly expanded the business by establishing petrol-filling stations all the way from Kingston, on the Dumfries-Carlisle road, to Beattock Summit, on the Glasgow road. Three years ago he purchased from Miss Fowle-Smith of Wyseby the house of Gretna Hall, a Georgian mansion with romantic associations with runaway marriages. When Fleet marriages were abolished in 1754, English persons desiring to be married secretly had to get out of England, to which only the Hardwicke Act applied, and the practice was to post to the Border and cross over to Gretna, the nearest and most convenient spot where runaway marriages could be legalised. There were several marriage houses in the area at that time, and Gretna Hall later became one of the most popular. When Mr Macintosh acquired the property he revived the marriage business. He converted an outhouse into a blacksmith's shop, and acted as priest,

dressed in picturesque Highland garb. During the two years he had been in Gretna Hall he performed 500 marriages. It will be recalled that last year Mr Macintosh was the defender in an action in the Court of Session relating to this business. Mr Macintosh was an ardent Highlander, and was an enthusiastic member of the Carlisle Highland Association. He was also a member of Gretna Lodge of Freemasons, and was connected with the Royal Arch Chapter. He was a sergeant in the Dumfriesshire Special Constabulary. Mr Macintosh, who was fifty years of age, leaves a widow, but no family. The funeral, which will be of a Masonic character, takes place to Gretna Cemetery on Monday.

Gretna Green mourns the death of its most picturesque figure, Mr David Ramsay Macintosh, 53-year-old "priest" of Gretna Hall, whose death occurred from pleurisy. Many villagers wept when they heard of the passing of the kilted laird of Gretna Hall. Since he began marrying couples over the anvil at the blacksmith's shop in the courtyard of the old Georgian mansion house two years ago, he had become known to thousands of people in this country and abroad. Since he married the first couple in the New Year of 1938 he had performed over 500 weddings. When the war began the Government reprieved the ban on Gretna marriages, and with the departure of the "priest" from the rival smithy, Mr Macintosh became the only officiating personality at Gretna Green weddings. To-day Gretna Green is without a "priest." Mr William Macintosh, of Carlisle, a brother, said to a reporter last night that the future of Gretna Hall's runaway marriage business was as yet undecided.

Mr Hugh Mackie, the owner of the famous blacksmith's shop at Gretna Green, died on Saturday, aged 84, at Gretna House, Gretna. Mr Mackie's association with the smithy dated back 65 years to a day when as a youth he was one of the witnesses to a marriage performed over the anvil. The wedding gave Mr Mackie an idea. He saw possibilities in the development of the smithy as show-place which might attract visitors from all over the country. When the smithy came into the market 30 years ago, Mr Mackie, who had become a prosperous farmer, bought the building. More than 50,000 people now visit the smithy each year, paying sixpence a head for admission, while there has been an average of 300 marriages a year during the past six years. The business was in fact so great that Mr Mackie formed a company, consisting of his wife, his three daughters, and his son, to conduct the affairs of the smithy. The marriage of a Glasgow lorry driver last Tuesday brought the total for this year to 23, and Mr Richard Rennison, the "blacksmith-priest," said yesterday that the letters had received indicated a record rush at Easter. At the time of his death Mr Mackie owned the entire village of Gretna and many acres of the surrounding land.

Removed Flower Stand From Grave

What was described as a very unusual and distressing case was heard in Annan Justice of Peace Court on Friday, when ex-Provost John Currie, Annan, presided. Mrs Janet Wallace, wife of John Wallace, labourer, West 1. Gretna, was charged with removing a flower stand, the property of Mrs Sarah Muir, Currock, Carlisle, from the grave of her husband, Pte. Edward Muir, in Gretna Cemetery to B West 1, Gretna, and smashing it with a hammer. Accused pleaded guilty, and Mr K. G. Sutherland, solicitor, Annan, appeared on her behalf. Mr James Henderson, Dumfries, who prosecuted, said Mrs Muir placed the flower stand on her husband's grave at Gretna Cemetery, and afterwards she discovered that it had been removed, and she found a brown paper parcel in her garden at Carlisle with a letter. It could not have been written by Mrs Wallace, for she could not write. On opening the parcel she found that the parcel contained the flower stand she had placed on her husband's grave, and it had been smashed with a hammer. The police made inquiries and they discovered that Mrs Wallace had taken away the flower stand and smashed it, and afterwards dropped it in Mrs Muir's garden. Mr Sutherland stated that Private Muir was in the Royal Army Service Corps and was killed in an accident at Norwich in August last. The widow had no means to pay the funeral expenses, and Mrs Wallace, the lad's grandmother, who had brought him up and was greatly attached to him, paid the expense of bringing the body home and having it interred in Gretna Cemetery, at a cost of £8 10s. Mrs Wallace discovered that the widow had received funeral benefit to the amount of £31 from a society with which he was insured. Mr James Currie, Gretna (one of the presiding Justices): And also the pension. Mr Sutherland, continuing, said Mrs Muir made no attempt to pay any of the expenses, and that led to some ill-feeling. Mrs Wallace put flowers on the soldier's grave and told Mrs Muir she could do the same if she wished, but she objected to Mrs Muir putting on the grave anything else, such as a flower stand. Notwithstanding that Mrs Muir placed a flower stand on the grave, and Mrs Wallace admitted that she had removed it and broken it up. This was a most distressing case, and in view of all the circumstances he asked the court to deal leniently with the accused, who was 61 years of age and was very much distressed by the affair and having to appear in court. The Justices, after conferring, said they had decided, after hearing Mr Sutherland, to dismiss the case. Mrs Wallace: Will your honours tell Mrs Muir she has no right to the grave? Inspector Blackwood: The Justices cannot decide that. Mrs Wallace; Well, that is what all the noise is about.

FATAL ACCIDENT INQUIRY Dumfries on Thursday Sheriff Campion and a jury held a public inquiry into the circumstances attending the death of Thomas Neeson, timberman, Blackaddie Cottages, Sanquhar; James Booth, Jutland House, Eastriggs Township, Dornock; and George Henry Pike, C4 Eastriggs Township, Dornock. The following jury were empannelled: George Armstrong, timber merchant, 25 Moffat Road; John A. M. Jeffs, fishmonger, Church Crescent; Frank Holbrook, photographer, 62 English Street; John Douglas, fishmonger, 63 High Street; John Anderson, postingmaster, Commercial Hotel Stables; James Marchbank, joiner, 20 Shakespeare Street; and James Kay, grocer, 146 Lockerbie Road. James Kissock, depute fiscal, conducted the inquiry. In the first case Mr James Lohar, assistant secretary of the Ayrshire Coal-owners' Association, for the Sanquhar and Kirkconnel Collieries, Ltd., and in the two others Mr J. C. R. Macdonald, W.S., Dumfries appeared for the Ministry of Munitions. Mr James Burns, H.M. Inspector Factories, Kilmarnock, was also in attendance. - - - George Henry Pike, was employed as an acid circulator at Gretna, sustained fatal injuries the result of an explosion in the course of his employment the night of 12th March. In each case the jury returned formal verdict, and found that there was not sufficient evidence to show what caused the explosion in Pike's case.

MR GILBERT RITCHIE, GRETNA

The death occurred in Cumberland Infirmary on Friday night of Mr Gilbert Ritchie, newsagent and ironmonger, Central Avenue, Gretna. Mr Ritchie, who was 71 years of age, was a native of Glasgow. On completing his education, he was for some time engaged in Canada and the United States; and settled in Gretna in 1914, opening a newsagent's and ironmonger's business in Central Avenue. He was a founder member and past master of Lodge Gretna Freemasons, and was present when Gretna Masonic Hall was bombed, when several members were killed in 1941. He was a popular and highly respected member of the community. He is survived by his widow, one son, and a daughter. The funeral took place yesterday afternoon to Gretna Cemetery.

He-purchased from the Disposal Board the Institute at Gretna, and promoted its use for entertainments until the building was acquired by the County Council to relieve congestion in Gretna Township School: Captain Shand was also the proprietor- of the Union Jack Hotel, which was the stopping place for the night express bus from Glasgow to London, as well as much other bus and transport traffic. Captain Shand presented to St Ninian's Roman Catholic Church, Gretna, of which he was a member, pictures depicting the Seven Stations of the Cross. He is survived by his widow, and one son, who is in the Royal Air Force.

Dr Smith went through the whole of the Crimean campaign, and it was he who certified the death of Lord Raglan. Deceased was widely known over the South of Scotland. He survived by his widow and only daughter.

OBITUARY NOTICES THE REV. JOHN O. STAFFORD The death occurred at a late hour on Monday evening of the Rev. John O. Stafford, M.A., who had been minister of Gretna for the past thirty-five years. Mr Stafford

was a son of Mr James Stafford, who was for thirty-six years headmaster of Mouswald Public School. He was educated at Dumfries Academy and Glasgow University, where he took his Arts Course, graduating M.A. in 1890. He was licensed by the Presbytery of Lochmaben in 1893, and his first appointment was assistant in Old Deer, Aberdeenshire, and he was afterwards assistant in Dunblane Cathedral. In 1900 he was ordained and inducted minister of Mochrum, and in 1906 he was inducted to Gretna. Mr Stafford took an active interest in public affairs, and served on the School Board, the Education Authority, and Dumfries County Council. He was a prominent Freemason. On the occasion of his semi-jubilee in 1925 he was presented with pulpit robes and a purse of Treasury notes from his congregation, and Mrs Stafford, by whom he is survived, was presented with a salver.

The Rev. J. O. Stafford, Gretna Manse, received notification on Saturday that his son, Lieut. Kenneth Stafford, had been seriously wounded, and was lying in hospital in Rouen. Lieut. Stafford was shot in the head on the Monday previous, and his condition is still critical. A short time ago Lieut. Stafford was slightly wounded at the Italian front, and after recovery he returned to the fighting line in France.

GRETNA MINISTER'S SON KILLED. Lieutenant Kenneth James Stafford, only son the Rev. John 0. and Mrs Stafford, The Manse, Gretna, has died of wounds. Lieut. Stafford proceeded to Edinburgh University from Clifton Bank School, St. Andrews, in March 1916, joining the O.T.C. at that time. Ho received his commission in February, 1917, and proceeded France five months later. From France he went Italy in November, and in the spring of this year he was again fighting in France. Slightly wounded two months ago, Lieutenant Stafford succumbed to wounds received on the 4th inst. He was 20 years of age.
